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Welcome to your *Childcare Summer Induction Pack*.

This task requires you to carry out some research in order to investigate a topic of your interest. The research you gather will enable you to answer the below questions and prepare you for the discussions that will be taking place during the first week of your study this September.



Investigate an area of personal interest that you would like to know more about. Gather information and compile a "project" by researching and writing up your findings. Add images and diagrams to illustrate your research etc.

Bring your project with you on your first week of college for us to discuss and utilise - possibly in the form of a self-study wall display.

Some suggested areas might include:

- Why is outdoor play important for children?
- Why do older people need social interaction?
- What can be done to reduce childhood obesity? Why is this important?
- What can be done to reduce adult obesity? Why is this important?
- Is technology damaging children's social skills?
- How can older people be taught to use technology?
- How important is spelling and grammar?
- What behaviours are expected of professionals that work in Education or Care?
- If you had a million pounds, how would you spend it to enhance the lives of children in your local area?
- If you had a million pounds, how would you spend it to enhance the lives of adults in your local area?
